SHIP/IHDE Data Quality Improvement Process

Ruby Cash with the Idaho Health Data Exchange (IHDE) provided an overview of the SHIP/IHDE Data Quality Improvement Process. This process covers goals 2 and 5 of SHIP and focuses on maintaining data integrity and resolving data gaps between connected SHIP clinics by using Clinical Quality Measures (CQMs) and an analytical dashboard. This is done by working with clinics to review reports, find gaps, problem solve the identified gaps and implement solutions.

Questions and discussion regarding this process took place by CHC members. Results/clarification of the discussion includes the following:

- Clinics are being notified as they are ready to start the process and Ruby will be participating in clinic site visits. The process will take 3-4 months per clinic site.
- CHC members suggested the needs for more communication to the clinics regarding what the CQM priorities are – choosing 5-6 CQMs that clinics can be working on simultaneously.
- Also suggested utilizing the QI Specialists to assist clinics in working on the first set of CQMs.

Accountable Health Communities Grant - CMS

Palina Louangketh from Saint Alphonsus Health Alliance provided an overview of the Accountable Health Communities (AHC) grant opportunity through CMS. This grant is a 5 year funding opportunity to address social determinants of health needs within the community. The project, titled the Social Needs Awareness Project (SNAP), is designed to increase beneficiary awareness of available community services through information dissemination and referral. Saint Alphonsus Health Alliance would act as the bridge organization, linking patients to resources. Opportunities include utilizing the Central Health Collaborative as an advisory board for this work. Project implementation is pending CMS announcement in summer of 2017.
