Agenda Items:

Mental Health Crisis Center

Chris Christopher with the Pathways Community Crisis Center of Southwest Idaho and Teresa Shackelford with Region 4 Behavioral Health provided a presentation on the new mental health crisis center that is scheduled to open in Boise in early December. Their presentation provided a high level overview of the outreach done and partnerships developed to build the crisis center. They highlighted funding, timelines, staffing and services provided at the center. Chris mentioned that the highest number of referrals tend to be self-referrals or referrals from friends and family. They are looking forward to the opening.

Caregiver Integration Project

Kim Thurston provided an update on the Regional Collaborative Caregiver Integration Project. There have been three educational lunch and learn webinars held to date. We saw an overall increase in attendance from 3 attendees in the first webinar to 25 attendees at the final webinar. These webinars will act as an introduction to a larger, in-person training that will be held in December.

The CIP leadership team is scheduled to present at the Idaho Medical Managers Forum Luncheon on October 19th from 11:30am-1:30pm at St. Alphonsus. A survey was developed by the CDHD SHIP team regarding clinic knowledge of community based resources and understanding of how to refer to these resources. 93% of survey participants stated that they would attend a half-day event to network with community agencies in order to learn more about their services and how to refer to them.

The plan is to host a networking event for resources across the lifespan on **December 6th from 1:00-5:00pm** at the West Ada Training Center in Meridian. This event is designed to bring together

community-based service organizations and clinic staff to discuss resources for patients and families across the lifespan. Organizations attending to share their resources include Blue Cross, Idaho Parents Unlimited, Legacy Corps, Idaho Nutrition Associates, and Ada County Paramedics etc. In addition to the 30 organizations that have signed up to attend, we have also had 30 clinic staff members from our various SHIP clinics sign up to attend.

Pathways Community HUB

Melissa Dilley provided a presentation on the Pathways Community HUB model and introduced how we might apply this model in the local communities within Region 4. CHC members participated in a discussion around the model and what barriers and challenges may exist to implementation. Overall the discussion included the following:

- A need to define care coordination vs. care management, where do they differ, overlap, is there a need for care coordination, where does it fit in?
- A need to understand high risk populations and where gaps in available resources exist
- Commercial payers may already be working on this, the community is just now exploring value based contracts, concerns related to duplication with this model
- Emphasis on the importance of linking the local public health district (PHD) to the clinical community and growing the role of the PHD by addressing social determinants of health
- Need to include other stakeholders around the table for this conversation (i.e. St. Luke’s)
- Next steps include connecting with Michigan Pathways to Better Health Program in Muskegon to learn their model, identify gaps in care for our population, etc.
